WHAT ALL THE WAITING HAS BEEN FOR

Today's readings are as familiar to most of us as the carols we sing and the commercials that overwhelm this holiday season. Often Christmas finds us tired, struggling with preparations and expectations. What we really want to feel is joy and peace. The stress of preparation, of waiting, is reflected in both Isaiah and Paul's letter to Titus. Luke tells us of the exhaustion that Mary and Joseph felt: a young pregnant wife and her husband, forced to travel just as she is about to give birth, unable even to find a room to stay in. It must have been miserable. They must have been afraid. In the midst of this exhaustion, misery, and fear, a child is born, a Son is given. The world is then filled with light and hope, joy and peace. In that moment they, and we, know what all the waiting has been for.

Each day for 365 straight days, he will release a 30ish-minute podcast episode in which he reads a section of the Catechism of the Catholic Church and then offers a short reflection on those topics. On the first Sunday of each month at 10:15 a.m., Deacon and Mrs. Pohlmeier will lead a discussion group in the library about what was covered in the previous month's podcasts. (The first group discussion will take place on February 5.) The Catechism of the Catholic Church is the definitive document outlining all of Catholic belief and practice, and this is the perfect way to learn it more deeply.

FAQ

Find the podcast on Apple or Google and listen each day beginning January 1, 2023. If you miss a day, you can catch up another day. There are a few bonus episodes there already.

Do I have to listen to the podcast to attend the group discussion?

Nope. If you listen, great. If you read the Catechism, great. If you do neither, come anyway. All are welcome.

Do I have to come every month? No, but you are encouraged to. You will get the most out of it as sessions build on each other, but if you miss one, please don't stop coming.

Do I have to own a Catechism? No, but it is a good idea even if you don't listen to the podcast. The Catechism is recommended as a staple for any Catholic household. There is a standard second edition with a green cover available from any major bookseller. Ascension Press has also released a new edition with extra resources specifically for Fr. Mike's study. The entire text is also available in many places online.
