Architect Visit

Mac White & Michael Madsen (Michael G. Imber Architect Firm- MGIA) presented a slide show of the latest drawings for our new church. The presentation was followed by Question and Answer time for parishioners.

Changes reflect challenges that we have faced designing the church that our parishioners want, while remaining on budget and being fiscally responsible with your sacrificial donations.

Elements of the church design that have moved to Phase II include:

- Covered dropoff -there will still be an ADA dropoff, but it will not be covered.
- Tower -there will be a base for the tower in the current phase, so the tower can be completed later in phase II.

Catholic Churches with a classical design have a history of being built overtime. The height and materials needed to build a church that is a recognizable Catholic Church are more labor intensive.

We continue to strive to build the church that our parishioners desire.

Prior to the Meet & See for parishioners, Nabholtz representatives joined architects from MGIA & Core Architects for the 50% DD (design documents) meeting with our design team. Our 100% DD meeting with MGIA, Core, Nabholtz, and our design team will happen in January. Construction Document phase will follow completion of DD phase.
